- Livestock within the barn can only be moved by the owner or superintendents.
- Stalls may not be reserved.
- Straw must be pushed to the center of the barn after the show.
- There is no electricity available at the wash rack, and none is allowed at that site.
- Livestock is released at the close of the entire livestock show.
- Classes will be divided by breed if the number of entries warrant division.
- Showmanship classes will be split.
- Adult, youth to be divided by age of participants.

1. Entries will be sorted into classes as they enroll.
2. Each owner will be limited to 10 rabbits.
3. Any breed recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders' Association may be shown. Each ARBA recognized color constitutes a variety.
4. Exhibitors may enter no more than four rabbits in each class, per variety.
5. All rabbits must be owned by May 1 of the current year, except younger rabbits raised.
6. Each rabbit is to be legibly and permanently tattooed in its left ear for identification. If this is not done before check-in, it will be done then.
